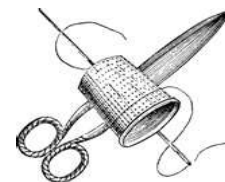




Kids Fun and Creative Sewing Classes



Parents have been asking us for ages, if we could offer classes in the art of “Hand sewing” for children. Sadly this is not an activity enjoyed on the school curriculum anymore. We wanted to ensure that we had a calendar of projects that would progressively develop your child's sewing skills, in a fun and accessible format.

We are now proud to offer a full range of classes that will take children aged from 8years upwards through the art of sewing, step by step. Covering all the basic sewing stitches & techniques, in practical but fun projects. Our tutor Heather, is not only CRB checked but an experienced seamstress and school teacher.

Classes are £10 per person. This includes an hour and a half tuition and ALL materials required to complete each project. There are no more than 6 children per group to ensure they all get the tuition time required to complete their masterpieces.

- 9th May - Felt Heart or Star – first Blanket Stitch then Embellish with Buttons & Beads
- 16th May - Ribbon Weaving Cards – Learn the knack of weaving with a variety ribbons
- 23rd May - Pencil Hats – Develop your running stitch, Cross stitch and beading skills
- 30th May - Jubilee Bunting – Be prepared for the jubilee celebrations with 1.1/2mtr bunting.
- 13th June - Toadstool Card – Beautifully created using Stab stitch & French knots
- 20th June - Spider on a leaf Magnet or Brooch – Incorporates so many of the stitches learnt to date including, Stab, Straight, Back Stitch, Lazy Daisy and French Knots.
- 4th July - Sampler Coaster – Take the first steps with this Embroidery sampler using straight and cross stitches
